Assistantship funding is guaranteed for four years of doctoral study and tuition remission awards are part of all doctoral assistantships. The assistantships during the first four years will include a blend of research, teaching, and some administrative work. An award of a full-time graduate assistantship carries the expectation that the student will be available for 20 hours per week for 9 months. Half-time graduate assistants need to be available for 10 hours per week. The assistantships in years five and beyond may involve teaching, administrative work, or research, depending on the nature of the available options.
