The American Heritages Interdisciplinary major (9 courses/27 credits) is designed for students in the Lynch School of Education and Human Development who are pursuing Elementary Education, Applied Psychology and Human Development, or Transformative Educational Studies majors. The major is recommended for students who are interested in the American heritage from literary, social, and historical perspectives.
