

Perspectives on Spanish America Interdisciplinary Major

The **Perspectives on Spanish America Interdisciplinary Major** (9 courses/27 Credits) is available as a second major to students in the Lynch School pursuing an Elementary Education major, Applied Psychology and Human Development major or Transformative Educational Studies major. It is not an option for students majoring in Secondary Education. The major is recommended for students who may have had at least two years of high school Spanish and wish to develop Spanish language skills, coupled with a background in the historical, sociological, and literary traditions of Spanish-American cultures. This major is particularly appropriate for students with an intended career objective to work with those of Hispanic origin.
