IMPORTANT NOTES ON ENGLISH MAJOR REQUIREMENTS

Seminar Requirement: Only an English course with a title that starts with **Seminar** will meet the Seminar requirement. A course that counts as a Seminar may also fulfill another English major requirement. Courses listed as "seminars" in Eagle Apps do not count for the English Major Seminar requirement.

Courses with Multiple Designations: Some courses have more than one designation. (E.g. ENGL 4441 Race in the Middle Ages fulfills pre-1700 or RBL) A course with multiple designations can fulfill either requirement, but not both.
