The Dalmatian Coast, on the eastern shore of the Adriatic Sea, is one of the most intriguing destinations in the Mediterranean. The region offers spectacular scenery, ancient, medieval, and renaissance history and art, and charming towns and villages. I invite you to join us on this voyage as we sail from Venice, Italy to Athens, Greece and discover the rich culture and history of this majestic corner of the world. This special tour will highlight BC Beyond Educational Travel's threefold mission to provide lifelong learning through educational travel, to showcase BC faculty, and to expand the global reach of Boston College.

Begin our itinerary by strolling across Venice's Piazza San Marco, viewing St Mark's Basilica, Doge's Palace, and the Grand Canal. Marvel at the intricate canals, bridges, and gondolas as well as the city's acclaimed art and sculptures. We'll then depart the center of the former Venetian Empire to explore the historic coastal towns of Croatia, including Dubrovnik, one of Europe's best-preserved medieval cities.

Further south, we venture into Italy's Puglia region to marvel at the trulli houses of Alberobello, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, before continuing to Milos, Greece. There, we explore the fishing village of Pollonia, the ancient site of Trypiti. We will end the tour in Plaka, built on a ridge on the site of ancient Milos, and known for its historic charm and neoclassical architecture.

Joining the voyage to offer expert insights into the complex history of the Mediterranean region is **Dr. Aleksandar Tomic**, Associate Dean at Boston College's Woods College of Advancing Studies.

Our vessel for this ocean journey, EXPLORA II, launched in 2024, is equipped with the most advanced safety and environmentally responsible technology available and is designed to maximize luxury in a relaxed, informal, and friendly environment. The emphasis throughout is on comfort, wellness, and extraordinary culinary experiences. The smallest of the all-suite accommodations is 377 square feet, including a private terrace. The extensive wellness facilities include multiple indoor and outdoor exercise spaces, four heated pools, and a large spa. Dining options, available in six different restaurants, range across cuisines from Europe to East Asia.

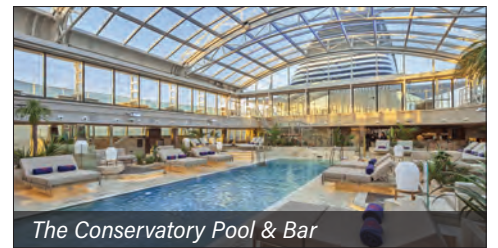

Launched in 2024, EXPLORA II is dedicated to maximizing luxury in a relaxed, informal, and friendly environment. With a gross tonnage of 63,900 GT, the ship is comparable in size to vessels that carry over 2,500 passengers, but EXPLORA II has only 461 suites, accommodating fewer than 900 guests. This allows for spacious suites (the smallest suite is 377 square feet) and extensive public areas, including 67,000 square feet of outdoor deck space, twelve bars and lounges, multiple indoor and outdoor pools, and over 10,000 square feet of fitness and wellness facilities. All of this with a staff to guest ratio of 1 to 1.25.

Featuring the latest advances in technology and engineering, EXPLORA II is at the cutting edge of environmentally responsible operations. It is equipped with a selective catalytic reduction system to reduce harmful emissions; its water treatment and waste management systems are state-of-the-art; it is equipped throughout with LED lighting and high-efficiency, energy-saving appliances; its recycling protocols exceed the highest industry standards; and no single-use plastics are employed aboard. It is also RINA Dolphin-certified, ensuring reduced underwater noise and contributing to the

preservation of marine life.

Dining options aboard include six restaurants offering a variety of cuisines—Italian, Pan-Asian, French, Mediterranean, and European steakhouse—as well as in-suite dining. Unlimited beverages, fine wines and premium spirits, as well as specialty coffees, teas and soft drinks are available at all times. High-speed WIFI is complimentary throughout the ship, as are 24-hour concierge services and 24-hour in-suite dining. Twice-daily housekeeping services include an evening turndown service.

ITINERARY



Friday, June 5, 2026
DEPART THE UNITED STATES

Saturday, June 6
VENICE, Italy

Arrive in Venice and transfer to the *Splendid Hotel* (or similar) for overnight. La Serenissima, the most serene Republic of Venice, founded in the 8th century as a small city-state at the northern end of the Adriatic Sea, by the 13th century had come to dominate not only the surrounding Veneto but also much of the Mediterranean Sea. The massive wealth generated by Venetian trade with the East is still evident in the great public squares and monuments of the city. Gather this evening with fellow travelers for a welcome dinner. (D)

Sunday, June 7
VENICE

After breakfast, explore St. Mark's Basilica and the Doge's Palace. The interior of the Basilica is covered with 14,000 square feet of gold mosaics, mostly from the 12th and 13th centuries, and the altarpiece known as Pala d'Oro is universally considered the most refined expression of Byzantine sensibility in the world. The Doge's Palace, combining Gothic, Renaissance, and Mannerist elements, was the working center of Venetian government when Venice dominated the entire eastern Mediterranean. In the afternoon, enjoy time at leisure for independent exploration. (B)

Monday, June 8
VENICE/EMBARK

In the morning, tour the Scuola Grande di San Rocco, whose walls and ceilings are covered with murals by Tintoretto, and the Basilica Santa Maria Gloriosa dei Frari, with its treasure trove of paintings and sculptures by artists including Titian, Canova, Sansovino, Donatello, and Bellini. After lunch at a local restaurant, transfer to nearby Fusina to embark *EXPLORA II* and sail in the evening. (B,L,D)

Tuesday, June 9
ROVINJ, Croatia

From the 14th through the 18th century, Rovinj was the center of Venetian government on the Istrian peninsula of Croatia. On your walking tour of the old city, you will see the Venetian influence everywhere, including in the emblematic bell tower of the main church of the town. After lunch aboard the ship, a short drive north of Rovinj brings you to the historic town of Poreč, home to the 6th-century Euphrasian Basilica, a UNESCO World Heritage Site famous for its gem-studded mosaics, which we will visit. (B,L,D)

Wednesday, June 10
ZADAR

Arrive in Zadar, a city whose early history was shaped by Roman and Byzantine rule, and later came under Venetian control from the 15th to the 18th century, when it served as a critical port for the Venetian navy. Explore the historic core of the city, including the Roman Forum; the 9th-century Church of St. Donatus; the Cathedral of St. Anastasia—one of the finest Romanesque churches in Dalmatia; and

the Archaeological Museum, which traces the city's long and layered history. (B,L,D)

Thursday, June 11

DUBROVNIK

Situated on a small rocky peninsula at the foot of a mountain, Dubrovnik thrived from the 12th to the early 19th centuries as the independent republic of Ragusa. The wealth attained during this time from the maritime activities of its large fleet is evident in the exceptional beauty of the streets and buildings of its historic center, which is one of the most perfectly preserved medieval entities in Europe. Explore the historic center in the morning, seeing its architectural gems, including the Sponza Palace; the old custom house; the Rector's Palace, dating from the 11th century; the Church of the Franciscans, with its monastery and garden cloisters; and the fountain of Onofrio, among others. Surrounding the old town are the medieval walls, which provide wonderful views of the town and its coastline. Spend the afternoon at leisure to enjoy this unique place on your own. (B,L,D)

Friday, June 12

BRINDISI, Italy

From Brindisi in Italy's Puglia region, take an excursion to nearby

Locorotondo, rated as one of the most beautiful towns in Italy. Set on a hilltop, its stone-paved streets lead to the pedestrian historic center, where the public garden offers panoramic views of the Valle d'Itria, the surrounding countryside and valley. Continue to Alberobello, a UNESCO World Heritage Site that features over 1,500 trulli buildings. These remarkable, white-washed structures have pyramidal, conical or domed roofs built of corbelled local limestone without mortar, using a prehistoric building technique that has survived to this day. Lunch will be provided at a local restaurant. (B,L,D)

Saturday, June 13

AT SEA

Attend lectures, relax, and enjoy the many amenities of the ship as you sail. (B,L,D)

Sunday, June 14

MILOS, Cycladic Islands, Greece

Arrive in the morning in Milos, one of Greece's most striking islands. Of volcanic origin, the island has been inhabited since prehistoric times, and it is known for its magnificent coastal landscapes. Land at the lively port of Adamas, set on a spacious bay, and from there explore the island, including the attractive fishing village of Pollonia, the ancient site of Trypiti, where the celebrated statue of *Venus de*

Milo, now at the Louvre Museum, was found, and where we will also find a well-preserved theater dating from the Roman period as well as Early Christian catacombs. End the tour in Plaka, the charming main village of the island. Built on a ridge on the site of ancient Milos, Plaka presents the typical Cycladic white-washed architecture and delightful lanes. We will visit the Archaeological Museum, which displays a rich collection of artifacts, and have free time to enjoy Plaka on your own. (B,L,D)

Monday, June 15

PIRAEUS/DISEMBARK

After breakfast aboard, disembark in Athens' port of Piraeus and transfer to the airport for flights homeward. (B)

OPTIONAL POST-TRIP EXTENSION IN ATHENS | June 15 – 17, 2026

There will be a 2-day optional extension with accommodations at the centrally located *Athens Capital Hotel* (or similar). Included are tours of the Acropolis, the Acropolis Museum and the ancient Agora. Also included is a transfer on June 17th from the hotel to the airport, full breakfast each morning at the hotel, one lunch and one dinner, and the services of a Thalassa Journeys Trip Director.
