Esterquest Rites Set; Librarian at Harvard

Private service will be held for Ralph Esterquest, 61, Harvard Medical Librarian since 1958 and librarian of Francis A. Countway Library of Medicine at Harvard since 1965, who died Saturday.

He was the first Librarian of the Countway Library, the largest university-owned medical library in the country.

Prior to coming to Harvard he had been director of the Midwest Inter-Library Center, Inc. of Chicago. He had also served as assistant librarian at Institute for Advance Study at Princeton University and director of Pacific Northwest Bibliographic Center in Seattle, Wash.

Esterquest was a former president of Mountain-Plains Library Assn. and Chicago Library Club.

LUNENBURG, N.S.—Capt. Angus Walters, 87, skipper of the schooner Bluenose and an international racing champion, died here Monday. He had been hospitalized since May with a kidney ailment.

Walters sailed the Bluenose to international racing championships in the 1920s and 1930s. When the famous racing series started in 1920, the Gloucester, Mass., boat "Esperanto" defeated the Lunenberg schooner "Delaware."

The defeat led to construction of the Bluenose, which continued speed with the tasks required, including the sail bands.

Capt. Walters raced the Bluenose to her first victory in 1921, and won the best-of-three series against the New England entry in two straight races.

In 1926, Capt. Walters sailed the Bluenose in a series of races against the schooner "Gertrude L. Thebaud" of Gloucester. He sailed from Lunenburg as a fisherman until 1921.

Capt. Walters retired to the Lunenburg Dairy Ltd., which he sold in February.



Besides his wife, Lt Sullivan leaves his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Edward Sullivan of Watertown, three brothers and four sisters.


