San Sebastian Bishop, Critic of Franco Policy

San Sebastian, Spain The Roman Catholic bishop of San Sebastian, Mgr. Lorenzo Berceclartus, died Wednesday night at the age of 73.

Mgr. Berceclartus, most of his career as a churchman, caused a furor in Spain last month when he published a strong criticism of policy toward the Basques of head of state Francisco Franco. He entered the hospital shortly afterward.

The criticism was contained in a pastoral letter read in all churches in the San Sebastian Diocese. The letter alleged that Spanish police were breaking the Vatican Concordat by staging unauthorized searches of religious houses in his diocese.
