

And notwithstanding the great distance of time and difference of manners, the character is still in fashion. " And Samuel told all the words of the Lord unto the People, that asked of him a King. And he said this shall be the manner of the King that shall reign over you. He will take your sons and appoint them for himself, for his chariots and to be his horse-men, and some shall run before his chariots." (This description agrees with



2 Sam. x. 12. Be of good Courage, and let us play the Men, for our People, and for the Cities of our God: And the Lord do that which feemeth him good.





